**Divine Mercy Sunday**



**Each year during the Easter season of fifty days we hear of the life of the infant Church from the Acts of the Apostles.** We hear their resurrection faith united them so closely that they shared everything! No one was left in need. This year, each Easter season Sunday we hear the First Letter of St. John.

Today in our Gospel we hear the first appearance of the Risen Lord to the Apostles. They were still in the upper room where they had the Last Supper. They locked the door and closed the window shutters out of fear the Jews would find them and kill them too. Suddenly the body of the Risen Lord passed through the walls. Jesus showed them His Risen body. Thomas who had not been with them refused to believe until next Sunday when the Risen Christ again appeared to them and invited Thomas to touch the place of the wounds. Thomas believed and John tells us these things have been written so you may believe!

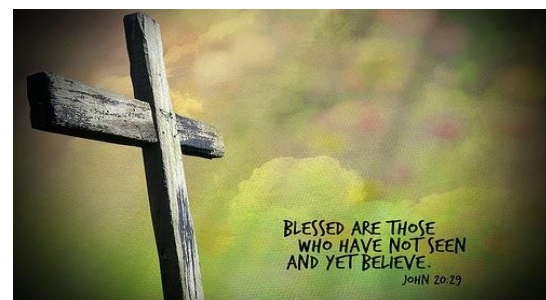
