1st Sunday of Lent

Each year the Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent is one of 3 Gospel accounts of Jesus in the beginning of His public ministry going into the desert. The desert is a harsh place- it forces human beings to the essentials of life. It puts us to the test. This year the first reading gives us an account of God promising Noah in the story of the great flood that He will establish a Covenant with His people. St. Paul in the second reading speaks of the flood as a sign prefiguring Baptism. Indeed the Lord or God is renewing His Covenant with us in the whole Lenten and Easter celebrations. Lent is a time to prepare converts for Baptism and that is the time for all of us to renew our Commitment of Baptism. We will be asked to renew our vows of Baptism at Easter.

In the Gospel we hear Jesus at the beginning of His ministry: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel." As ashes were placed on our heads on Ash Wednesday we heard the words- "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Lenten Guidelines

Prayer: We urge you to make the effort to participate in the daily Masses of Lent.

Penance: We are encouraged to do something difficult to strengthen our will power to resist sin and temptation.

Abstinence: All Catholics from age 14 on are expected to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting: All Catholics from age 18 to 59 are expected to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means ONE full meal a day: two other light meals, no snacks between meals. **These are the minimum expectations.** The church as our mother encourages us to do something so we can share the dying of Christ in order to rise with Him at Easter to New Life.

Works of Charity: We are challenged by the Church not only to open our hearts to God but to one another. Reach out to help the needy.

The Rice Bowl: This campaign of the American Catholic Church is an effort to help our hungry brothers and sisters. We are asked to have one simple meatless meal each week and give what we save to help the hungry.

Lent began as a time for the Church to prepare those who wished to join the body of Christ through the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. Please pray for people throughout the world preparing to receive these sacraments in the Easter Season.

Knights of Columbus annual Friday Night Lenten Fish Fry Dinners begin Friday February 19. Dinners will be served from 5:00 - 7:00 PM in Masci Hall, subject to COVID restrictions, with limited socially distanced seating available for members of the same household. In addition to our usual take out dinners, limited contact curbside service will also be available. Credit card payments are accepted. Telephone orders will be accepted after 4:00 PM for pick up after 5:00 PM. Please call or text (302) 598-8685. 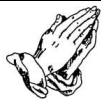
