When Solomon, the son of King David, became king God told him to ask for whatever he wanted. Instead of asking for material things, Solomon asked for “an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong.” He was asking for God’s help that he would be a wise, good ruler. (Unfortunately, in the rest of the story, wise Solomon became a fool, turning away from God.)

Jesus in the Gospel parables speaks of people who realize they have found a treasure, a “pearl of great price” and realize they should seek it with an undivided heart. They are truly wise.

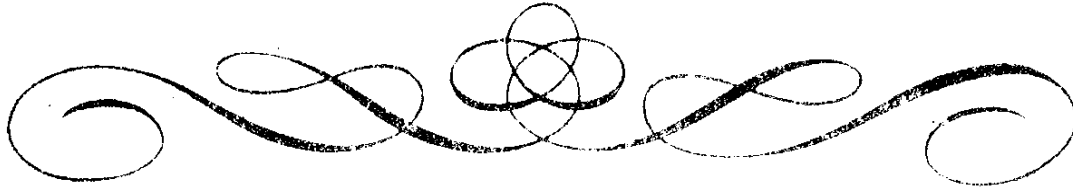
