Today we hear Moses, Paul and Jesus speak to us in the Scriptures.

Moses, about 1,300 years before Christ, speaking to God's people shortly before he died, called them to remember all that God had done for them. He had delivered them from slavery in Egypt and led them on their journey through the desert. And He fed them with manna – food that seemed to fall from heaven. In the Passover meal, they would remember by the holy, memorial meal all their God had done.

Jesus, after feeding thousands of people with a few loaves of bread, challenged the people to eat His flesh and drink His blood. He could not have said anything more shocking to them. Ever good Jew was taught never to eat human flesh and never to drink blood-even the blood of animals! He knew He was testing their faith! St. Paul, not one of the Apostles who were at the Last Supper, had heard from them what Jesus did at that Passover meal. Jesus had made the last Passover meal of the Old Covenant into the memorial Passover meal of the New Covenant. Jesus had taken bread and wine and changed them into His Body and Blood. Paul knew and he teaches us when we share the Eucharist, we participate in the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ. We become what we eat! We become the one Body of Jesus Christ!

Every time we come to Communion, we too are challenged in our faith. By our "AMEN!" We say 'we believe'

Changes in Light of the Novel Coronavirus from Bishop Malooly...

Delaware parishes of the Diocese of Wilmington may resume daily Masses and the Sacrament of Reconciliation beginning Monday, June 1, 2020.

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass issued on March 12, 2020 remains in place for the Diocese of Wilmington. Parishes should continue to make Masses available to the faithful through such means as internet livestream or recording, ensuring that the faithful may maintain a spiritual connection with their local church.

Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with national, state and local health directives. All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church for any reason. Likewise, anyone with a persistent cough or who otherwise does not feel well should not come to church.

Parishioners who are particularly vulnerable (e.g. over the age of sixty, existing heart or lung conditions, diabetes, or otherwise immuno-compromised) are **STRONGLY ENCOURAGED**, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Church until all restrictions have been lifted. Individuals are the primary protectors of their own health; during this current situation, there is always risk coming into public spaces. To that end, coming into an open church building carries that same risk. Individuals assume that risk for themselves in these circumstances.

All liturgical celebrations should observe limitations on gathering sizes and ensure social distancing.

All members of the assembly and all ministers, except the priest-celebrant, are to wear face coverings at all times while in church. The priest-celebrant is *permitted* to wear a covering during Mass but not *required* except during the distribution of Communion.

All members of the assembly and all ministers are to sanitize their hands upon entering the church.

Home visits to the sick by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion continue to be prohibited until further notice.
The Sacrament of the Sick should only be administered in danger of death situations only.

Masses of Christian Burial and Wedding Masses are not permitted until further notice. The rationale for this decision is to allow parishes to have a slow and gradual start up. The Bishop expects to lift this restriction once all parishes have had the opportunity to get through a week of daily Masses and one weekend of Masses.

We will continue to monitor the situation and adjust policy as necessary.

Let us continue to pray for our diocese, our health care workers, and for all affected by the coronavirus.
